

### DESCRIPTION

Third generation power MOSFETs from Vishay provide the designer with the best combination of fast switching, ruggedized device design, low on-resistance and cost-effectiveness.

The TO-220 FULLPAK eliminates the need for additional insulating hardware in commercial-industrial applications. The molding compound used provides a high isolation capability and a low thermal resistance between the tab and external heatsink. This isolation is equivalent to using a 100 micron mica barrier with standard TO-220 product. The FULLPAK is mounted to a heatsink using a single clip or by a single screw fixing.




Fig. 1 - Typical Output Characteristics, T<sub>C</sub> = 25 °C




Fig. 2 - Typical Output Characteristics,  $T_C = 150$  °C




Fig. 3 - Typical Transfer Characteristics




Fig. 4 - Normalized On-Resistance vs. Temperature






Fig. 5 - Typical Capacitance vs. Drain-to-Source Voltage




Fig. 7 - Typical Source-Drain Diode Forward Voltage




Fig. 6 - Typical Gate Charge vs. Gate-to-Source Voltage




Fig. 8 - Maximum Safe Operating Area






Fig. 9 - Maximum Drain Current vs. Case Temperature




Fig. 10a - Switching Time Test Circuit

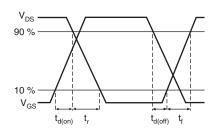


Fig. 10b - Switching Time Waveforms




Fig. 11 - Maximum Effective Transient Thermal Impedance, Junction-to-Case




Fig. 12a - Unclamped Inductive Test Circuit




Fig. 12b - Unclamped Inductive Waveforms






Fig. 12c - Maximum Avalanche Energy vs. Drain Current




Fig. 13a - Basic Gate Charge Waveform





Fig. 13b - Gate Charge Test Circuit



## Peak Diode Recovery dV/dt Test Circuit



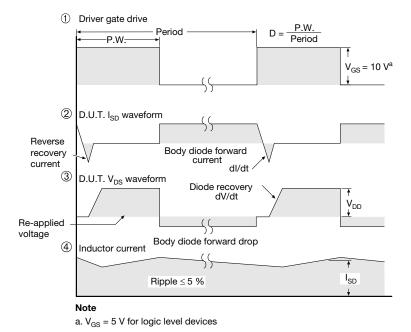


Fig. 14 - For N-Channel

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
